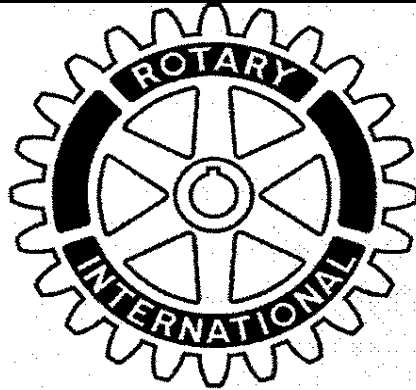
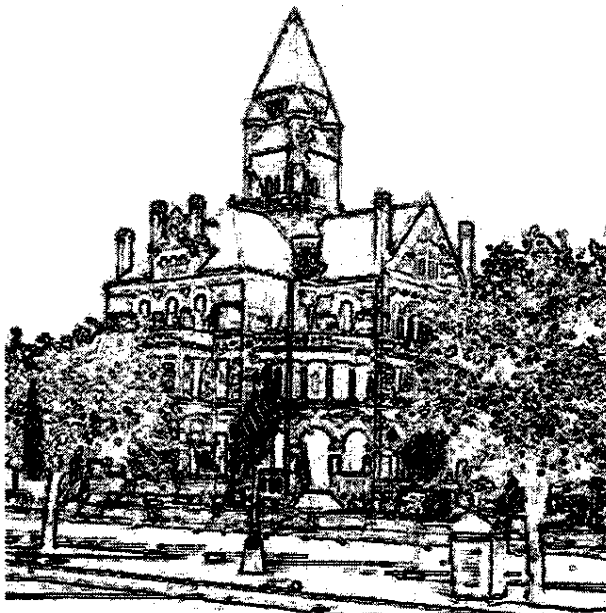

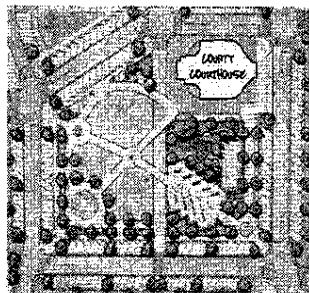
## Last weeks program: provided by Jim McLeroy

Last week program was a presentation by the mayor of Sulphur Springs, Gary Spraggins, regarding the development plans for downtown.

Highlights of the plan that still has to be approved by council are:

- A change from one way traffic around the square and on Main & Davis streets to two way traffic
- Removal of parking on the square itself

- "Back in" parking around the square
- A roundabout added at the "Y" where Davis and Gilmore Street come together
- The repositioning of the current memorial statue, and addition of veteran's

- The addition of a water feature, fountain on the square.
- The development and addition of "off square parking"

In addition the mayor discussed other possibilities including a greenway link to Heritage Park, and re-direction of streets in and around the downtown

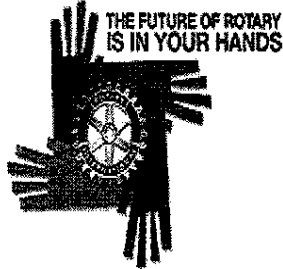
