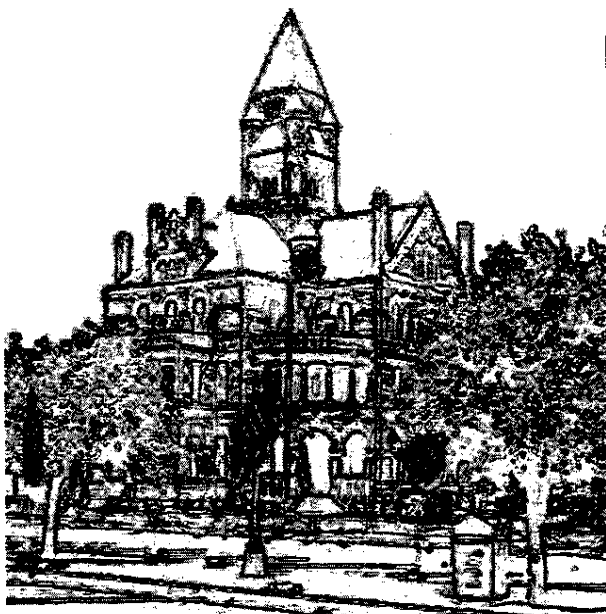

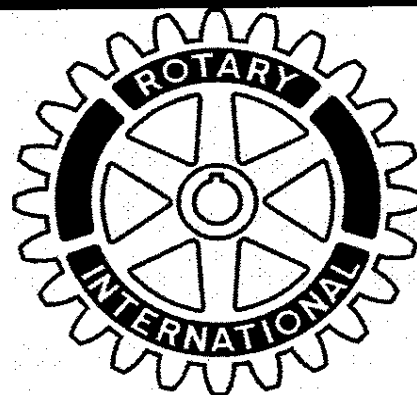

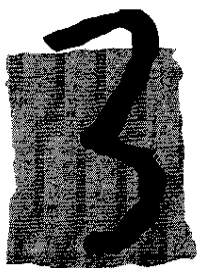

About the campaign

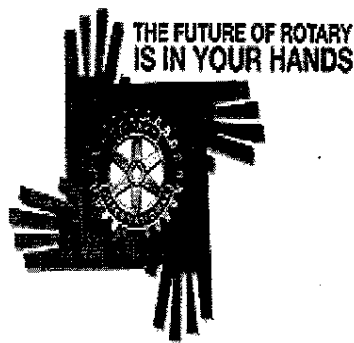
Make Up Meeting Opportunities:

Focus on Service

The Classification Principle

Virtually all membership in Rotary is based on a "classification". Basically, a classification describes the distinct and recognized business or professional service that the Rotarian renders to society.

The principle of Rotary classification is somewhat more specific and precise, however. The classification of the Rotarian describes the "principle or recognized business or professional activity of the firm, company, or institution with which an active member is connect or "that which covers the active member's principle recognized business or activity". In other words, classifications are determined by activities or services to society rather than the position held by a particular individual. For example, a member who is a president of a bank is classified not as "bank president" but under the classification "banking".

The classification principle also permits businesses and industries to be separated into distinct functions such as manufacturing, distributing, retailing, and servicing. Classifications may also be specific as distinct and independent divisions of a large corporation or university within the club's territory, such as school of business or a school of engineering.

The classification principle is a necessary concept in ensuring that each Rotary club represents a cross-section of the business and professional service of the community.
